



Water skiing



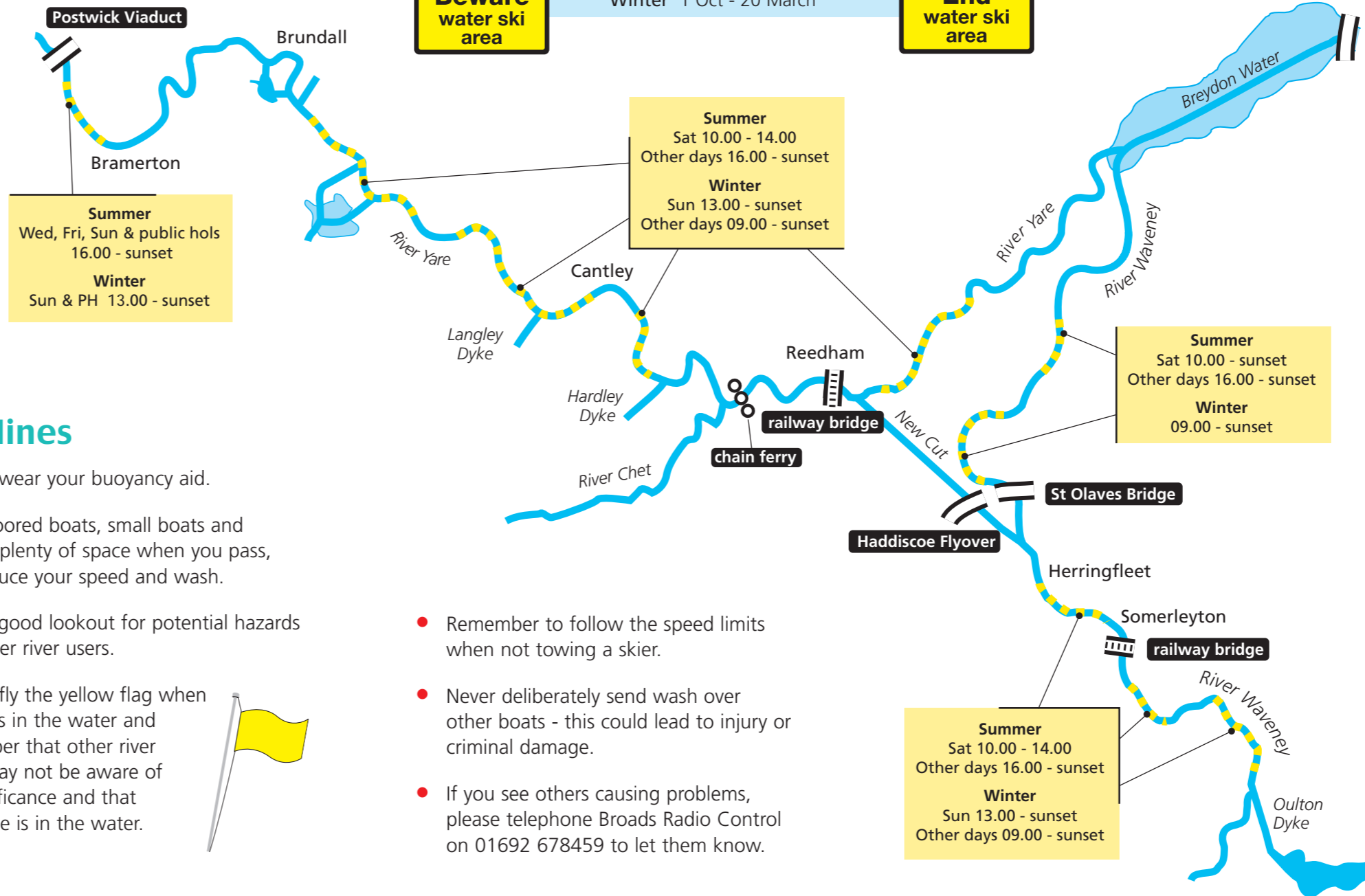
Requirements

for water skiing and wakeboarding on the Rivers Waveney and Yare

- ◆ You must have a licence for your boat.
- ◆ Your boat must also meet the criteria for a **Light Sports Vessel** as defined by the Broads Authority - a motor vessel with a block area of no more than 13 square metres, which has a planing hull, no permanent covered accommodation and is capable of towing a water skier.
- ◆ You must have a valid Broads Authority water ski permit (administration charge payable). To obtain this you must:
 - be a member of Eastern Rivers Ski Club www.erwsc.co.uk and British Water Ski www.britishwaterski.org.uk
 - have the BWS Ski Boat Driver's Award
 - have your boat insured
 - get an Annual Steering Condition check for your boat
 - get a Wash & Vessel Noise check for your boat
- ◆ You must follow the British Water Ski Code of Conduct, ERWSC Rules and Constitution, and adhere to the relevant Broads Authority Byelaws.
- ◆ You may only ski in the designated areas - these are signed on the banks.

Guidelines

- Always wear your buoyancy aid.
- Give moored boats, small boats and anglers plenty of space when you pass, and reduce your speed and wash.
- Keep a good lookout for potential hazards and other river users.
- Always fly the yellow flag when a skier is in the water and remember that other river users may not be aware of its significance and that someone is in the water.
- Remember to follow the speed limits when not towing a skier.
- Never deliberately send wash over other boats - this could lead to injury or criminal damage.

If you have to telephone in an emergency be as specific as possible about your location. Give:

- the name of the boat
- how many people are on board
- the name of the river
- the nearest village
- any nearby landmarks/post number
- the nearest 24 hour mooring site - this may include a grid reference
