Description/Context: - Red brick tower mill, converted in late 1970s to residential. 4 storey with windows at each floor. Concrete cap (now removed). Consent exist for the fitting of a traditional boat shaped cap. Currently roof sheeted over. Date 1847 crudely engraved on exterior brickwork to right of door. Mill also used to grind corn, (2 stones recorded as on site in 1987). Said to be “Sister” mill to Hunsett Mill approx two miles downstream.			
Significance: - One of an important group of drainage mills in the Broads area and a feature in the landscape.			
Threat posed: - Temporary sheeting to roof requires addressing.
