Description/Context: - Red brick tower mill shell, formerly three storeys, roof missing although portion of iron rack remains on top. Pronounced lean (subsidence), no machinery. One window opening at first floor level, enlarged brickwork openings formed from two opposite ground floor door openings. Forms an important group with other mills on site demonstrating the history of drainage of the marshes. Thought to be constructed during the 1830s and last used around 1900, when the nearby steam engine and Polkey's Mill took over the work of North Mill.			
Significance: - One of a significant group of drainage mills in the Broads area and a prominent feature in the landscape.			
Threat posed: - Subsidence, general erosion of brickwork - any further enlargement of openings could destabilise the structure very quickly without regular maintenance.
