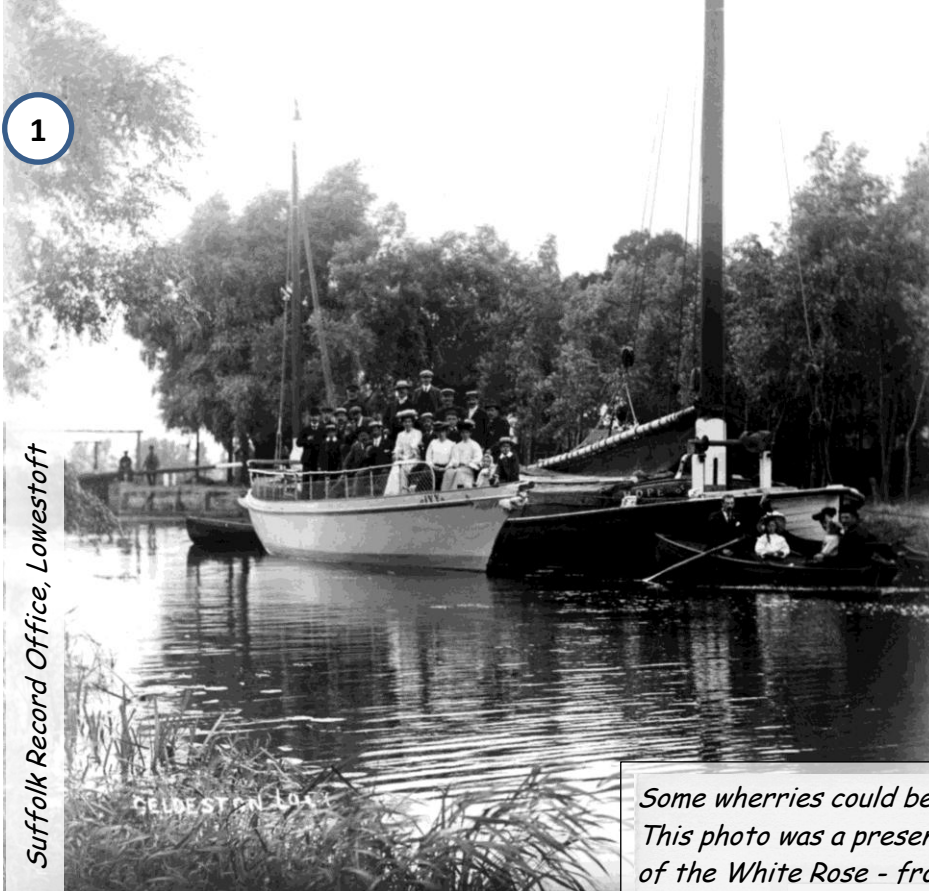


A group on a boat trip poses for a photo at Geldeston lock in the very early 20th century.

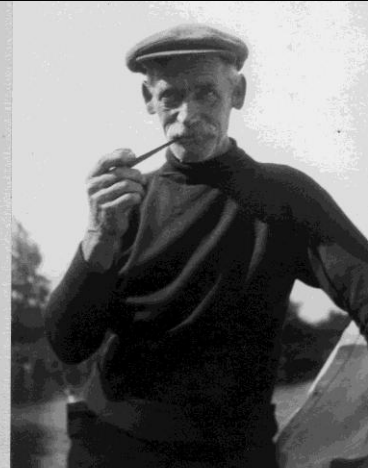
We had such a good time!
