<p>Description/Context: - Small tarred red brick circular tower stump (approx 7ft 6ins high) with batter and cemented shallow dome roof. Door at front, bricked up door opposite & small bricked up aperture (wheel arch?) at side ground level. Diesel engine inside (in working order) driving external pump. Original mill had 4 patent sails, boat cap & fantail, & drove a scoop wheel which had an extra spur wheel on the outside end of its shaft. Still working in 1936 but sails and top were off by 1947. Photograph exists dated as 1932 complete with sails, cap etc. Identified on OS sheet & in AC Smith's publication 'Drainage Mills of the Norfolk Broads' – supplement of 1994.
