<p>Description/Context: - Very small 2 storey red brick tower mill converted to studio with octagonal timber glazed 'look out' on top, with octagonal/pyramidal black felted roof. Tower about 16' 6" high to top of brickwork and 10' 9" diameter at base including 18" thick walls. Timber door & 20c window at 2nd storey level. Derelict pump adjacent. In reasonable condition. Patress plates at first floor level.</p> <p>Converted to studio mid 20th century by local artist Rowland Green.</p>			
<p>Significance: - the substantial remains of one of an important group of drainage mills in the Broads area and a feature in the landscape.</p>
