<p>Description/Context/Significance: - Practice rifle firing range – date unknown. 224 mm thick Fletton brick retaining wall, approximately 1.8 m high on low side, with raking concrete piers at approximately 1.5m centres and centre horizontal steel angle reinforcement. Approximately 18 m long. Probably considerably reduced in height at decommissioning.</p> <p>Waveney Forest is the site of a number of military fieldworks from both World Wars and in the 1940's was used by the US army as an infantry training area with a rifle range on land adjacent to the River Waveney. At that time the area was mainly heath land, the forest plantation dating from the 1960s. Not recorded in the NHER.</p>
