Description/Context: - Small red brick tower mill converted to residential. 3 storeys with external stairway and balcony, glazed octagonal 'look-out' on top with octagonal/pyramidal lead(?) roof. Timber large pane windows to each floor and door/loading opening converted to window at the 3 rd storey. Single storey black stained timber and corrugated metal roof attached. AC Smith records that the mill was badly damaged by fire in 1912 – 14 & converted to residential use in 1934. In good condition.			
Significance: - One of an important group of drainage mills in the Broads area and a prominent feature in the landscape.			
Threat posed: - No immediate threat.
