Description/Context: - World War One pill box (circa 1916 – 1918), circular concrete block construction. Angled doorway and gun apertures, the latter complete with blast doors. One of a line of inland from Weybourne to Sea Palling, broadly along the seaward side of the River Ant.			
Significance: - A rare survival of WW1 pill box. Identified on the Norfolk HER under Stalham parish register. Other military defences identified in the area, principally of WW II date.			
Threat posed: - No immediate threat, but gradual decay if not regularly maintained. Possible threat of vandalism.
