## **NOTICE TO MARINERS**

### **USE OF WEIGHTED HEAVING LINES**

Mariners and Port-Users are advised that there continues to be regular reports of incidents within the wider Ports Industry involving inappropriately weighted heaving lines being thrown during mooring operations.

Some of the weights that have been identified would cause very serious injury or even death should they strike an individual – even one wearing appropriate PPE.

Whilst the attached notices have previously been promulgated, it is hoped that highlighting the contents will further educate Vessel crews into the dangers of using such weights, and may reduce the possibility of incidents occurring. Any such instance of heavily weighted heaving lines used in the Port of Lowestoft will be reported to the local MCA Office to allow enforcement action to be taken against persistent or serious offenders as deemed appropriate.

Agents, Owners and Vessel masters are advised to bear these guidelines in mind when conducting mooring operations in the Port of Lowestoft.

#### DANGEROUSLY WEIGHTED SHIPS HEAVING LINES

There have been several instances where dangerously weighted heaving lines, including the use of monkey's lists with additional weights inserted into thom, have been used resulting in serious mury.

#### Accidents caused by Heaving Lines

In the last year several accidents have occurred involving the injured party being hit by the heaving line during mooring operations.

Remember the ship's master, pilot and crew will require a line ashore as soon as possible. As the ship approaches the quay a heaving line will be thrown ashore.

- It may not be possible to see them throw it.
- It may be heavily weighted.
- The crew may not shout a warning or you may not hear it.



Wear your PPE.

Report any dangerous heaving lines.

Please always stay alert and watch for heaving lines coming your way!
