Description/Context: - Drainage Mill. Towers mill stump. Tarred red brick tower reduced to 2 storeys with remains of conical roof timbers (in very poor condition). Ground floor door opening accessed through attached shed, two opposing semi-circular arched headed windows at first floor with remains of w/ glazing bars. One floor and ladder internally. Adjoining shed clad in sheet corrugated iron. Had scoop wheel and part of brick mill race remains. Most recently used for agricultural animal/storage enclosure.			
Significance: - Although in poor condition, the mill tower stump is one of a significant group of drainage mills in the Broads area and a feature in the landscape.			
Threat posed: - Water ingress and continued brick erosion, vegetation damage.
