25 July 2013 Minute 1/9 Water Quality Across the Broads and Habitats Regulations Assessment	The Broads Authority is considering its response to technical information renewal of two agricultural abstraction licences around Catfield Fen. To assist the Authority in gaining independent hydrological advice.	Senior Ecologist	The Environment Agency is considering the renewal of two agricultural abstraction licences around Catfield Fen area to determine the potential impacts they are having on the Ant Broads and Marshes Site of Special Scientific Interest, component of The Broads Special Area of Conservation, Broadland Special Protection Area and Broadland Ramsar. The Agency is working through the key stages of the Habitat Regulations Assessment. Within April this involves consulting with Natural England and Broads Authority as statutory consultees, before moving through to producing their determination report and consulting on their minded to decision, prior to making their final decision in the later part of the summer.
