Strategic Priorities 2015/16

1. Broads Plan Review

Review and update the Broads Plan, the strategic management plan for the Broads. Work with partners, local communities and other stakeholders to assess achievements (Broads Plan 2011) and set aspirational strategy for 2017-22. The proposal to develop a long-term navigation strategy will be assessed as part of this review.

2. Broads Landscape Partnership Bid

Submit an application to the Heritage Lottery Fund for £3m for a Landscape Partnership Scheme. If the application receives a successful HLF decision, subsequent development phase objectives will be developed. The proposed multiple projects within the bid would contribute significantly to the delivery of the Broads Plan.

3. Hickling Broad Lake Enhancement Project

Develop a long-term approach for the management of Hickling Broad, building on scientific evidence from the Broads Lake Review. In the short term, progress development of a number of smaller projects to meet immediate concerns.

4. Promoting the Broads

- Produce Broads National Park branding guidelines
- Review and update the Broads Sustainable Tourism Strategy and Action Plan in partnership with local businesses

5. Stakeholder Action Plan

Implement multiple actions in response to the issues identified in the 2014 stakeholder surveys of hire boat operators, private boat owners, residents and visitors.

Feedback on Broads Parish Forums

1. Introduction

1.1 The Audit into Consultation Activity and Partnership Provisions between January and March 2015 identified a need for formal feedback from each Broads Parish Forum to the Broads Authority. The recommendation from the Report is outlined below.

2. Feedback from Parish Forum

- 2.1 The most recent Broads Parish Forum was held on 17 June 2015 at Ranworth Village Hall. The format was a drop in session from 6pm, where people could chat informally with BA staff and members on a one-to-one basis about any issues of interest to them. This was to be followed by a 'round table' session at 7.30pm.
- 2.2 We wrote to Parish Clerks asking for specific items for the round table session and compiled the agenda based on their feedback. The agenda, which was sent to the parishes in advance, included items on waste management, footpaths, and an update from the BA on practical works in the area, access issues and any other questions.
- 2.3 Unfortunately attendance at the forum was extremely low, with only a handful of people attending, and the event was cut short once particular questions had been answered. The previous Ant and Upper Bure forum held at Ludham in September 2013 attracted 80+ people. The low attendance at Ranworth

was at odds both with this and with the attendance at the other forums in 2014, which attracted 40-70 people.

- 2.4 There are a number of possible reasons for this poor turnout, and we are assessing these in looking at future events.
 - <u>Location</u>: Previous forums were held in larger settlements and Ranworth may have seemed less accessible. Having said this, wider experience of holding public events has not highlighted any significant preference for locations; the geography of the Broads means that any location will be easy for some and difficult for others to get to, particularly those reliant on public transport.
 - <u>Publicity</u>: We sent notice of the event to Parish Clerks, Broads Forum, Broads LAF, Broads Tourism, volunteers and other local groups and organisations, and distributed posters via the local Rangers. The event was also publicized in the Eastern Daily Press, on Radio Norfolk and on the BA website. Previous events were featured in other ways such as local parish newsletters and noticeboards, and through a dedicated but time consuming poster drop round the local area. We could make better use of social media (such as Facebook, Twitter and Broads Blog) and websites. We may also need more direct mailings to interest groups and organisations, including those represented on the Broads Forum.
 - <u>Format</u>: The format of previous forums was a drop-in session from 5pm followed by a presentation from the BA and a Q&A session at 7pm. At Ranworth, the second half of the event was changed to a more formal, agenda-led round table discussion.

From feedback and observation, it seems that some people prefer to see a BA presentation, while others feel this makes their role too passive, with the BA 'talking rather than listening'. Some people also feel uncomfortable talking in front of an audience, although the drop-in part of the events allows them to chat on a one-to-one basis to the BA and other attendees, including invited representatives from partner organisations such as the RSPB. The round table approach is intended to give parishes a more leading role, but may be off putting to others.

- <u>Timing</u>: The early evening start was similar to that of previous forums and the mid-week choice was at the request of parishes. However, the time of year may be a factor. The well-attended events in Ludham, Beccles and Reedham were held in early spring or autumn. The Ranworth event was also held close to the larger BA Annual Meeting on 27 June.
- <u>Specificity</u>: The previous forums have tended to tie in with a specific local issue (e.g. Reedham Quay, Hickling Broad) that attracted people in. While the issue of waste management in Ranworth was very high profile 6-12 months ago, the Chair of the Parish Council indicated at the forum that this issue had subsided.

It may also simply be that the previous Ant and Upper Bure forum satisfied the general curiosity of parishioners and they did not feel the need to attend another such event.

3. Issues at Ranworth Forum

- 3.1 Issues raised by attendees at Ranworth covered access, cycling, footpaths, safety and some specific planning advice. All of these were deal with on the night without the need for further correspondence. Those who attended said they found the event useful, which is consistent with the comments made at previous events.
- 3.2 We have written again to Parish Councils asking for their views following the meeting, particularly where they raised agenda items but did not actually attend the event.

4. Future Forums

- 4.1 Attendance and feedback at previous forums, together with comments from the recent Residents' Survey, suggest it is worth continuing with interactive area-based forums. While such events can be resource heavy, when they work well they are a positive way for the BA and local communities to connect with each other. However, we need to address issues regarding timing, location, format, publicity and specificity to maximize attendance and make the events worthwhile to all. This includes looking at how we might encourage attendance that is more truly representative of the whole community, including young people.
- 4.2 There may be merit in timing the events around big issues or developments. For example, we could hold a Thurne and Lower Bure forum at a key stage of the Hickling Broad project, a Waveney forum in November should the HLF Landscape Partnership bid be successful, and a Wensum and Yare event to coincide with the River Wensum Strategy development. We could also consider moving the Annual Meeting at the Dockyard to a date earlier in the year and having a similar event in the autumn, possibly at a location in the Northern Broads.
