## Make a wherry

Wherries were big cargo boats which sailed on the rivers and Broads.

Usually there were just two people working on them – and sometimes only one.
Only one still sails. The wherry Albion.

(1) Go into a large space with the children.

Remind them that a wherry was 18 metres long and 4.6 metres wide.

Ask them to stand in a circle and then to move outwards until they've made a shape the same size as the outline of a wherry.

(Have a piece of string 18 metres long and another 4.6 m wide and check their shape's dimensions.) You'll be amazed at how big it is.

(2) In small groups, the children can make model wherries. There are many good photos of the Albian on the website
