Integrated Access Strategy: Update

Report by Waterways and Recreation Officer

Summary

This report gives an update on some of the strategic priorities identified in the Integrated Access Strategy.

1. Introduction

- 1.1. Every year, as part of the Integrated Access Strategy (IAS), we identify a number of strategic priority projects to be delivered by the Broads Authority and its partners.
- 1.2. Setting these priorities helps us target resources and external funding sources. Many of these projects cannot be delivered without working with external partners and therefore, where partnerships are already identified, the project will be scored higher in the priority scoring matrix.
- 1.3. A progress update on the highest priority projects is noted in Table 1

Broads Mills Trail	Status: On Track WMM staff are continuing work on the mills trails and aiming to open new routes through Halvergate marshes.	Broads Authority
Bure Valley Path	Funding has been secured and designs agreed. Work should begin in 2021. Although only the initial part of this route lies within the Broads executive area, this project is seen as a key tourist route into the Broads. The BA involvement is advisory only but ties in with other projects taking place in Hoveton.	Norfolk County Council Broadland District Council Broads Authority
Wherryman's Way Hardley Flood	Dredging will commence on the River Chet in Autumn 2021 with sediment being deposited onto the banks along the stretch between Chedgrave and Hardley flood. Wherryman's Way – Bramerton to Surlingham	Unfortunately, no funding source has been identified to carry out the bank stabilisation needed to restore this section of the route at this stage. Hoveton Riverside Park	Status: On Track Topographical survey completed and concept designs created. Officers from NCC have also joined the project team and funding sources are beginning to be identified. Land raising will take place in Winter 2021.	Broads Authority Norfolk County Council
